No changes to Toronto's holiday shopping regulations

Changes were proposed earlier this year to Toronto's shopping regulations with regard to public holidays. City Council did not adopt any changes and the City of Toronto Municipal Code, Chapter 510, Holiday Shopping, remains in force without any modifications.

The code, which regulates the types of retail establishments that can be open on public holidays and specifies the types of services that can be provided, generally requires (with exemptions noted below) retail businesses to be closed on nine public holidays. Those holidays are New Year's Day, Family Day, Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Victoria Day, Canada Day, Labour Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.

There are a number of exemptions to the regulation, including:

- small retail businesses of less than 2,400 square feet (223 square metres), provided they are only selling a select list of items
- pharmacies offering the dispensing of prescription drugs and using less than 7,500 square feet (697 square metres) of space
- art galleries
- gas stations
- nurseries, and
- retail businesses licensed under the Liquor Licence Act.

In addition, retail stores larger than 2,400 square feet (223 square metres) and pharmacies larger than 7,500 square feet (697 square metres) are able to open on public holidays (also known as retail holidays) provided a

section of the store/pharmacy is roped off to meet the maximum allowable size, and that the store/pharmacy only offers for sale the types of products outlined in the regulations.

Public Consultation on Alternative Voting Technologies

"Since August 2010, Elections Ontario has been reviewing alternative voting technologies. This includes extensive analysis and research on voting technology solutions with a particular emphasis on internet and telephone voting. The Chief Electoral Officer will submit a report on this issue to the Legislative Assembly before June 30, 2013.

An important component of this work is the need to engage key stakeholders and to provide a broader opportunity for Ontarians to provide input into this important initiative.

A public consultation on this issue closed on December 2, 2012. The information provided will assist in evaluating our principles and research conclusions. Key themes from the input will be included in our final report.



NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT Lakeview Waterfront Connection Project Credit Valley Conservation and Region of Peel

The Region of Peel and Credit Valley Conservation, with support from Toronto and Region Conservation and the City of Mississauga, are undertaking an environmental assessment to create a new natural waterfront park on the eastern Mississauga waterfront. The park will provide ecological habitat and enhanced public access to the lakeshore.

The environmental assessment is in accordance with the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. The Lakeview Waterfront Connection (LWC) Project is an element of the Inspiration Lakeview initiative that was initiated in 2010.



THE PROCESS

On December 5, 2012, the Minister of the Environment approved the Terms of Reference (ToR) for the LWC Project. The approved ToR and all project background information can be viewed on the project webpage: www.creditvalleyca.ca/lwc.

The environmental assessment will be carried out according to the ToR and the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act. Results will be submitted to the Ministry of the Environment for review. When the environmental assessment is completed, the public and interested stakeholders will be informed when and where the environmental assessment can be reviewed.

Members of the public, agencies and interested stakeholders are encouraged to participate in the environmental assessment process by attending public meetings or contacting staff with information, comments or questions.
