Eight of Toronto's beaches will open on Saturday

May 31, 2013

Eight of Toronto's 11 swimming beaches will be officially open this weekend. Lifeguards will be in place at all but three beaches on Saturday. The remaining three will have lifeguards in place by June 15.

Toronto boasts some of the best swimming beaches around. Eight of Toronto's 11 swimming beaches have earned Blue Flags over the past few years, making them a great choice for family fun and cooling down during the hot summer.

The City is required to apply for Blue Flag status annually and accreditation is still pending for 2013.

- Bluffer's Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend
- Centre Island Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend
- Cherry Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend
- Gibraltar Point Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards will be in place by June 15
- Hanlan's Point Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguard this weekend
- Kew-Balmy Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend
- Marie Curtis Park Beach lifeguards will be in place by June 15
- Rouge Beach lifeguards will be in place by June 15
- Sunnyside Beach lifeguards in place this weekend
- Ward's Island Beach (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend
- Woodbine Beaches (Blue Flag 2012) lifeguards in place this weekend

The City's Parks, Forestry and Recreation division operates and maintains all recreation-related beach facilities and amenities. This service includes regular beach grooming and care of washrooms and change rooms. Toronto Police Marine Unit provides lifeguard services and takes daily water samples on behalf of Toronto Water and Toronto Public Health.

Toronto tests beach water quality daily at its 11 swimming beaches from June through to Labour Day. These samples are analyzed, using the most stringent testing standards in the world, to ensure Toronto's beaches meet the highest water quality standards for swimming. If water tests show E. coli levels exceed the provincial guidelines of 100 E. coli per 100 ml of water, Toronto Public Health warns against swimming at the affected beach. Toronto's Blue Flag beaches met the criteria for swimming, on average, 96 per cent of the time last summer.

Updated Tall Building Guidelines

The updated Tall Building Design Guidelines that City Council recently adopted integrate and build upon previous City of Toronto tall building guidelines. The updated guidelines also establish a unified set of performance measures for the evaluation of tall building development applications city-wide.

"The updated Tall Building Design Guidelines provide greater clarity and certainty to some of the more common elements of tall building construction," said Jennifer Keesmaat, Toronto's Chief Planner. "The guidelines establish clear measurable objectives to help ensure tall buildings fit within their context, minimize their local impacts, and contribute to a safe and vibrant pedestrian realm."

Updates to the city-wide Tall Building Design Guidelines generally include: • clear language, layout and graphic illustrations

- strengthened connections to Official Plan policy, and
- emphasis on design excellence, heritage conservation and sustainable design.

Additionally, the guidelines now include specific measures to ensure that, during the planning and design of tall buildings, greater consideration is given to contextual fit, quality of life, cumulative effects of tall buildings, sunlight/shadow impacts, and the pedestrian realm.

Toronto is experiencing an intense growth of tall buildings. The updated Tall Building Guidelines represent the most current best practice approach to guiding this form of development. The guidelines harness the vitality and energy of tall buildings, ensure they perform to the highest architectural design standards, protect existing neighbourhoods and enhance Toronto's livability.

City Council's adoption of the Tall Building Design Guidelines is an important validation of the document as an essential implementation tool of the Official Plan. The guidelines will be used by City Planning staff in the evaluation of all new and current tall building development applications throughout the city.

Second round of public consultation with Toronto condominium residents

The City of Toronto is holding a second round of public consultation with condominium occupants. Over the next week, residents can attend an in-person consultation to discuss ideas to address issues and situations that arise from living in a condo.

The first round of consultations, held in February, sought to identify issues experienced by those who live in condos. This second round seeks to develop ideas to address some of the issues identified, such as local parks and open space, facilities for pets, parking and infrastructure.

The consultations intend to engage condominium residents, condominium boards, businesses located in condominium buildings, and property managers. These stakeholders, as well as other members of the public, are invited to attend one of the following meetings. All meetings are from 7 to 9 p.m.

Participants will be able to learn more about the condo study being conducted by the City, as well as have opportunities to share their thoughts. Each of the above meetings will include an overview presentation from the project team to share ideas about issues raised during phase one of the consultation, as well as facilitated discussions to seek input.

New Overhead signs erected on Gardiner Expressway and Lake Shore Boulevard

The City of Toronto has installed additional overhead changeable message signs on city roads to help keep traffic moving and improve driver safety.

Six new signs have been installed on Lake Shore Boulevard and the Gardiner Expressway. The new signs are being tested now and will be activated in June. This is one part of the city's more comprehensive strategy on managing congestion.

The signs are part of the City's Traffic Management Centre's Intelligent Transportation System, known as RESCU. The system is made up of 73 traffic cameras, 852 vehicle detector stations, 12 overhead message signs and 18 portable message signs. RESCU detects disruptions to traffic flow along the Don Valley Parkway, Gardiner Expressway, Lake Shore Boulevard and Allen Road.

The goal of the RESCU system is to reduce the number of collisions through early detection of roadway incidents and to improve the movement of people and goods on our roads.

When the flow of traffic is disrupted on a roadway, RESCU operators notify emergency services and change messages on the overhead signs to provide information to drivers.

In addition to providing timely information on traffic incidents, the signs also update motorists on traffic congestion and planned closures, enabling motorists to make decisions to avoid delays
