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Work to begin on Gardiner Expressway - Jarvis Street to Don Roadway

The City of Toronto will begin work to repair the Gardiner Expressway, from Jarvis Street to the Don Roadway, on July 22. The work will continue until December 2014.

To accommodate the work, two lanes of traffic on the eastbound Gardiner Expressway, from Jarvis Street to the Don Roadway, will be closed from July 2013 to December 2013. Two lanes will remain open to traffic.

During the full 18-month construction period, there will also be other short-term lane restrictions and closures required on the Gardiner Expressway (both directions), Lake Shore Boulevard (both directions), Jarvis Street to the eastbound Gardiner Expressway ramp and the westbound Gardiner Expressway to Jarvis and Sherbourne Street ramps. Construction will be scheduled in stages in order to minimize disruption to motorists on both the Gardiner Expressway and Lake Shore Boulevard. Most of the short-term lane closures will take place at night.

Motorists should look for messages about closures and other changes on the variable message signs located on the Gardiner Expressway, Lake Shore Boulevard and Don Valley Parkway.

Pedestrian access on Lake Shore Boulevard and along cross streets will be maintained at all times, however, some sidewalks, pedestrian pathways and bike lanes may need to be closed for safety reasons when work is taking place in the area.

While the current work is taking place, the Gardiner Expressway and Lake Shore Boulevard Reconfiguration Environmental Assessment and Urban Design Study is being completed to determine the future plans for the area. For more information, visit http://www.gardinereast.ca

Update on special garbage collection for flood-damaged materials

The City of Toronto is continuing to provide special garbage collection for damaged materials due to flooding following the intense rainfall on July 8.

Due to the significant volume of materials that need to be collected, additional time is needed for collection crews to reach all areas of the city. Residents are asked to be patient but can be assured their waste will be collected. They should also be aware that regularly scheduled garbage, recycling and organics collection resumed this week.

City of Toronto waives fees for disposal bin permits to assist residents after major storm

The City of Toronto is waiving permit fees for the placement of private disposal bins within the public right of way to assist with clean up after the recent flooding incidents.

The permits, which usually cost \$49.89 a day, will be offered to residents free of charge from July 17 to 31 only. Pending approval of the application, disposal bins will be allowed to be placed within the public right of way.

Free permits will be offered under the following conditions:

- Applicants must live at the property and provide proof of residency
- Permits must be obtained and start no later than July 31
- Permits will be issued for no more than five days.

(Note: The bins themselves are not provided by the City. Bins can be rented from private disposal companies.)

City of Toronto seeking to engage all residents on future of housing services for vulnerable Torontonians

The City of Toronto is inviting all residents to share their views on the delivery of services that prevent homelessness and help some of Toronto's most vulnerable residents find and keep permanent housing.

The City encourages all Toronto residents to get involved in the housing services conversation and go online to complete a survey about what services they feel are important, what gaps in service may exist, and what ideas they have about how to better integrate services such as eviction prevention, assistance to find affordable housing, drop-in centres and emergency shelter access.

The City will work with input from the public, service users, service providers and interested groups to develop a Housing Stability Service Plan. The plan, which will inform the City government's planning, management and delivery of housing services over the next five years, will be considered by City Council in the fall.

The City of Toronto will spend about \$665 million this year on housing and homelessness services, with the majority of it going to social housing subsidies. About \$164.5 million is invested through community agencies and City programs to provide housing and homelessness services such as emergency shelter, housing help and eviction prevention services, and other supports.

The web page also offers the content as a workbook that can be downloaded/printed.

The Housing Services at a Glance material provides a convenient summary and will be useful for an understanding of the complexities of housing and homelessness issues. The City will also use the website as a way to report back to the public on the ideas and direction that result from the consultations.

Evans Avenue and The West Mall


Major Road Resurfacing on Evans Avenue from the West Mall to Sherway Gate; The East Mall to Ourland Boulevard and on The West Mall from Evans Avenue to the Queensway.

Expected Project Start Date: July 29, 2013 Expected Completion Date: November 30, 2013

The City of Toronto will be resurfacing; replacing damaged sidewalk, curb and guttters, catch basins, etc., in order to improve the roadway. This project is part of the City's Capital Works Program.

Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and appreciated.

Construction Details

- cold milling of the existing asphalt and resurfacing the roadway including localized full depth repairs to the road base.
- · replacing damaged sidewalk, road base, catch basins, etc.
- Traffic signals work at Sherway Drive, Sherway Gate, Bestobell Road, Treeview Drive.

You will be notified if there are any significant changes to the construction schedule or work to be undertaken.

Work Hours

Work will typically take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. from Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

Disruptions

As with all construction projects, there will be noise and temporary inconveniences. In order to complete the work effectively and in a safe manner, some pedestrian and traffic restrictions will be necessary. Every effort will be made to reduce the inconvenience. The City appreciates your understanding and co-operation.

Parking Restrictions

Construction will require temporary closure of private driveways. Where the property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times. Further notice will be given prior to the temporary closure.

Boulevard Work

Work in the boulevard in front of homes will be required to accommodate sidewalk and curb and gutter replacement, and water service connections.
