Please note, at the end of this newsletter is a top hit list of “Songs” Gina has put together to give to the DJ - James.

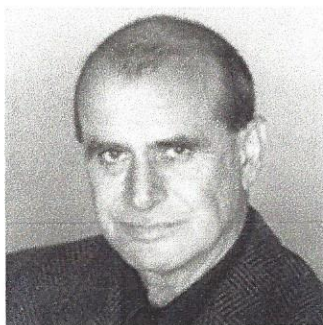

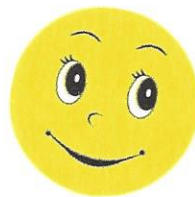
